16 17 18	Welcome and Public Comment		
19 20 21 22 23 24 25	Mr. Hill opened the meeting and explained that the board was here to explain the West Main project and the reasons and need for the park residents to complete the income survey. The meeting was largely a question and answer session between the board, the residents, and Ms. LaBounty as the park owner's representative regarding the water and sewer extension. Mr. Clark explained the need for the income survey to qualify for federal grants, and why it was important to the project. The discussion from the residents centered around concerns among the residents of park conditions:		
26 27 28 29	damaged pavement; standing water; no fire hydrants and a chlorine smell in the water; and some complaints about unsafe items found on the ground around the park. The residents were reluctant to help the park owner develop the property unless their concerns were addressed first.		
30 31 32	The residents were highly concerned that this project would be an excuse for the owner to install a rate surcharge on them, without any way for residents to know what his costs were.		
33 34 35 36 37	The Water Commission explained the project and how it would benefit the residents with water quality and fire protection. The Water Commission assured the residents that their goal was to avoid financial punishment for them and were willing to put into the contract that no surcharges or unusual water restrictions would be placed on the residents due to this project.		
38 39 40 41 42 43	stress the importance some of the concerns make sure that concer	proughout the meeting discussions were made on these topics. The Water Commission wanted to ress the importance of keeping the project moving forward and the chance for the town to address ome of the concerns of the residents through protections in the contract. The residents wanted to ake sure that concerns were heard and understood by the Water Commission. Residents were ged to consider completing the income survey and returning it to the surveyor, Tom Clark.
