- October 24, 2013@ 12:53 hours, Officer Rick Greenough and Chief Alan Buck responded to a call on Jericho Road for a heroin overdose. The male suspect was known to us and was unresponsive

at time of arrival. Members of Richmond Rescue were treating the suspect and had to give him two shots of Narcan before he started to come around. He was transported to the Fletcher Allen Hospital where he was met by Officer Greenough. The male was on a 24 hour court issued curfew and was not to leave his S. Burlington residence without the courts approval. He was flash cited to appear in court to answer a charge of violating court conditions.

- October 25, 2013@ 22:32 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth was called to the Lucky Spot store for an attempted break-in. A suspect had been identified in this case and the investigation is continuing.
- October 29, 2013@ 23:41 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell was called to Tilden Ave. for a fire within a pickup truck. Prior to arrival the male suspect who is well known to the police department fled the scene. At 08:33 hours the next morning, Chief Alan Buck responded back to the scene where the initial male was located back inside the vehicle. A severe burn was discovered on the suspect's lower leg and Richmond Rescue was summoned to the scene. The male was transported to the Fletcher Allen Hospital. It was determined that the fire was not accidental, but was a suicide attempt. The male who had numerous court conditions to include no drinking was given a roadside breath test which registered a BAC of .048%. He was held at the hospital for treatment of the burn and the suicide issue and flash cited into court for the following week to answer a charge of violating his court conditions. He may face an additional charge of arson.
- November 1, 2013@ 23:16 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth was called to Riverview Commons Park for a suspicious motor vehicle complaint. Officer Lindemuth located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The male operator who was on Federal parole conditions was suspected of drunk driving. A breath test was administered which registered a BAC of .128%. The suspect was charged with DUI and the Federal Probation & Parole authorities were notified.
- November 2, 2013@ 16:45 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell was called to Cochran & Duxbury Road for what was initially reported as a medical assist. It turned out the female operator was highly intoxicated. A roadside breath test was administered which registered a BAC of .223%. She was taken into custody and processed for DUI. She refused to take an evidentiary breath test at the office.
