- May 13, 2014@ 18:55 hours, Officer Lance Martel was advised by dispatch to BOL for a vehicle travelling northbound on the interstate that appeared to be intoxicated. Lance positioned himself by exit 11 when he observed the vehicle. After establishing additional probable cause he stopped the vehicle which was being operated by a female from the State of Tennessee. The operator was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI and she refused to provide any breath samples. She was processed and released on a citation to appear in court to answer a charge of DUI and refusal. She has a prior DUI conviction in her home state.
- May 14, 2014@ 15:30 hours, Officer Martel and I responded to Summer Street for a suicide attempt. The female tenant had repeatedly slashed her arms. This was the second time in the last few months we have responded to this home for her attempting suicide. She was transported to the emergency room for a mental evaluation.
- May 15, 2014@ 17:45 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell was called to a suicidal male on Phoenix Circle who was attempting to hang himself with a rope from an elevated tree house. Cpl. Hansell was able to talk him out of the tree and it was discovered he had an arrest warrant out on him. The subject was taken to the emergency room for an evaluation. After waiting four (4) hours he along with the attending doctor were advised that mental health would not be coming to evaluate him and to take him to the jail as he would be evaluated by a judge the following morning. He was lodged on the warrant at the regional jail.
- May 19, 2014@ 21:41 hours, Officer Lance Martel was dispatched to backup Hinesburg Police at Triple L trailer park for a large fight in progress. Five area departments and 10 officers responded to the scene. The main aggressor in this incident was transported to jail by Lance after Hinesburg processed him for DUI and disorderly conduct.
- May 22, 2014@ 09:28 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth was advised of a vehicle parked behind the Jonesville Post Office unattended. I was in the area and responded to the scene. The vehicle was a 2009 Ford F-250, 4WD pickup belonging to Walker Construction. An initial check of wanted did not show the vehicle stolen so I contacted the company. It was discovered that the vehicle had been stolen from their Waterbury /Stowe site earlier and they had yet to notice it. The company came to retrieve the vehicle while myself and Officer Lindemuth interviewed a local suspect who denied any involvement. The initial case is now being handled by a Trooper out of the Middlesex Barracks and based on the different stories the suspect has given each of us it is believed he stole the vehicle. Vermont State Police Middlesex will be doing additional follow-up on this case.
- May 24, 2014@ 02:15 hours, Officer Lance Martel stopped a vehicle on West Main Street for exceeding the speed limit by 19 mph. The male operator was later taken into custody for

suspicion of DUI and processed. He blew a BAC of .109% on the Datamaster evidently machine. The operator was cited into Chittenden Superior Court to answer a charge of DUI.

- May 24, 2014, Officer Brett Lindemuth completed his investigation into the shooting of a home on Locust Knoll earlier in the month. After working with Fish & Wildlife Warden, the State's Attorney's office and conducting many interviews it was determined to charge four (4) additional people with reckless endangerment involving a firearm. A total of five people have now been ordered into Chittenden Superior Court.
- May 25, 2014 in the morning, Officer Brett Lindemuth assisted with traffic control near the Richmond Mobil. More than a 1,000 motorcycles taking part in "Vermont Thunder" left Rogers Lane and the Mobil headed north on Interstate 89 to complete the charity ride for war veterans.
- May 26, 2014@ 10:46 hours, Officer Rick Greenough conducted a traffic stop on Summer Street. The male operator was found to be under criminal suspension. This is the 4th or 5th time in the last few months that members of Richmond Police have stopped him and charged him with operating a motor vehicle while criminally suspended.
