- February 27, 2014@ 17:37 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell stopped a vehicle on West Main Street after the Vermont State Police had issued a B.O.L. for a possible intoxicated driver on the interstate. Cpl. Hansell positioned himself near the off ramp when he observed the vehicle exit the interstate and head east on West Main. He devolved his own probable cause and then stopped the vehicle. The male operator was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and did provide a roadside test which registered a BAC of .115%. The operator was taken into custody and processed for DUI. He refused an evidentiary breath test and was taken to the Chittenden County Correctional Center on a felony charge of DUI #3 and was to be arraigned the next day.
- March 1, 2014@ 22:29 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with defective equipment and an expired registration. While speaking with the male operator roadside he detected an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. He requested and was granted a consent search where he located a small amount of green leafy material which later tested positive for marijuana. The male operator was screened for possible DUI/drugs but was released with a civil ticket for possession of marijuana, less than 1 ounce.
- March 2, 2014, after a lengthy investigation that started just prior to Christmas, Chief Alan Buck has charged a female resident of Richmond Terrace with False information to a law enforcement authority. The female suspect wanted to file attempted murder charges against four other female residents claiming that they tried to kill her by cooking and eating popcorn. Her claim was that she was severally allergic to popcorn and corn products and had stated so to the staff for several years. When she was informed that I would need medical documentation of her condition she stated that she had it but could not find it at the time, but would locate it and turn it over with her sworn statement. After the fact she went to an area doctor and self reported her condition and provided me with a letter. After interviewing the doctor it was determined that there was no medical documentation of her having any allergic condition to corn, popcorn or any other item. Several witnesses were interviewed that had witnessed her eating popcorn in the past.
- March 3, 2014@ 18:47 hours, Officer Lance Martel was dispatched to Stage Road for a deceased female. After arriving at the scene, Officer Martel contacted Officer Rick Greenough the department's certified death investigator. Working with family, care giver and the medical examiner's officer it was determined that the 94 year old female died of natural causes. Her body was then released to the family for burial.
- March 6, 2014@ 19:47 hours, Cpl. Jake Hansell was dispatched to a home on Phoenix Lane for trespass complaint. A male subject who we had arrested in the past for aggravated assault was located in the garage of the home in violation of his court ordered release conditions. He was taken into custody by Cpl. Hansell and processed prior to being lodged at the Chittenden County

Correctional Center on a charge of violating conditions of release. He was to be arraigned in Superior Court the following day.
