## TOTAL ARRESTS: 5

- January 15, 2014@ 09:10 hours, Officer William Bullock began an investigation of a burglary at Blue Flame Gas located on Gov. Peck Road. A suspect in the case has been identified since the initial burglary. Working with Det. Lavoie of the Williston Police, Officer Bullock has prepared affidavits of probable cause to charge the suspect. As of this morning (012814) a request for two search warrants are being applied for to search locations in Richmond and South Burlington.
- January 15, 2014@ 17:22 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth was assisting the U.S. Marshall's fugitive task force. They were attempting to locate a male who was wanted on charges of assault&robbery as well as aggravated sexual assault. Officer Lindemuth was able to locate the male in question within Riverview Commons Park and advised the Marshalls that he was on foot. The suspect was in the parking lot of the Lucky Spot store when the Marshalls attempted to take him into custody. During the initial takedown, Officer Lindemuth's cruiser was struck by another vehicle damaging the right front headlight assembly. The suspect was taken into custody and is being held on \$50,000 bail.
- January 16, 2014. We welcomed the addition of Mathew Nadeau to the force. He was sworn in as the newest officer at the Town Clerk's office and will be starting the full time police academy on February 3, 2014.
- January 16, 2014, Officer William Bullock after weeks of investigation was able to close out a theft complaint that came in. Working with area banks and requesting a subpoena for records he was able to charge a former female Richmond resident with false tokens. The female suspect was the same women responsible for all the recent pocketbook thefts from victims shopping at area supermarkets. She was located at at the Chittenden County jail and cited into court.
- January 17, 2014@ 05:46, Chief Alan Buck assisted the Vermont State Police with a suicidal/assaultive 17 year old male at a home located on Sunnyview Drive in Jericho. As the first officer on scene the male was being subdued on the floor by the step-father who had been assaulted by the teenager. The teenager had used a 12" butcher knife to cut a portion of his arm. I secured the scene and members of Essex P.D. and Essex Rescue arrived. The teenager was transported to Fletcher Allen accompanied by Essex P.D. I took photographs of the bite marks on the step-father and later e-mailed them to the investigating Trooper who I diverted to the hospital to meet the suspect and the parents.
- January 17, 2014@ 18:06 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth responded to a fight in progress at the Richmond Park & Ride. Two males in their twenties became involved in a knock down brawl. One male was transported to the hospital after having an eye gouged. After discussion it was determined that both males will be charged with simple assault, mutual affray.
- January 20, 2014@ 13:15 hours, Officer Rick Greenough was called to a two vehicle accident near Bridge and Church Street. One vehicle had fled the scene after rear ending the first vehicle. Officer Greenough located the vehicle off the road on Hillview as the operator was attempting to flee to his home. The male operator was screened for DUI and blew a roadside test of .176%. He was transported back to the officer for processing where he refused to take the evidentiary test. He was cited and released facing charges of DUI, DUI refusal and leaving the scene of an accident.
