- December 15, 2015@09:16 hours, Cpl. Brett Lindemuth had an abandoned vehicle towed from the Park & Ride located by exit 11. The vehicle was not stolen and had been left at the site for over two weeks.
- December 16, 2015, Officer Mat Nadeau wrote two additional search warrant request regarding our ongoing drug investigation and search warrant that we executed on West Main Street. These warrants were for additional electronic devices.
- December 17, 2015@12:55 hours, Cpl. William Bullock stopped a vehicle on Hillview Road for a minor traffic violation. The male operator was discovered to be currently criminally suspended, had no valid registration or insurance and was in possession of a small amount of marijuana. He was processed back at the office and released on a citation ordering him to appear in court to answer the DLS-C charge as well as ticketed for no insurance, no registration and possession of marijuana. The operator had five prior civil violations for operating under suspension.
- December 17, 2015, Officer Mat Nadeau finally received the lab analysis back from a suspected drug he seized during a traffic stop back in August. The lab confirmed that the drug was DMT a hallucinogenic powder that is commonly used along with marijuana or tobacco. When located again the suspect will be cited into court for possession of a regulated drug.
- December 17, 2015@20:22 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau took a theft complaint from a Lower Circle home in which approximately \$120 in cash was stolen. This was not a forced theft and the suspect is known to the victims. This investigation is ongoing.
- December 18, 2015@18:35 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau stopped a vehicle on East Main Street for speeding, operating left of center and defective equipment. The 25 year old male who was currently criminally suspended was also found to be under the influence of alcohol and had his two young children in the vehicle. He was taken into custody and processed at the office where he registered a BAC of .113%. He was cited into court to answer the charges of DUI, DLS-C and cruelty to children under ten years of age times two. He was released to his wife after processing. Cpl. Rick Greenough assisted in this case by looking after the children until she could come out from Williston to pick them up at the scene of the original traffic stop.
- December 19, 2015@22:34 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau conducted a traffic stop on West Main for defective equipment. While speaking with the operator he could smell a marijuana odor coming from the vehicle. He requested a consent search which was granted. During the search he recovered multiple marijuana pipes, two plastic baggies with green leafy material which tested positive for marijuana and an unknown amber crystalline substance. The operator advised that the unknown substance was given to him by a friend advising that that it was something you smoke to get you super high really fast. Officer Nadeau issued the operator and female passenger court diversion paperwork for the possession of marijuana as both were under 21 and sent the unknown substance to the state lab for analysis which can take months before the report is received.
- December 21, 2015@14:58 hours, Cpl. Brett Lindemuth took a theft complaint from a Wortheim Road home owner. The victim had two packages delivered to her home that

contained Christmas gifts and a check totaling approximately \$400.00 that were stolen from her roadside mailbox location. Right now there are no suspects in this case.

- December 22, 2015, Cpl. Rick Greenough the School Resource Officer at Camel's Hump Middle School delivered food care packages to multiple families in the Richmond area. The food was collected by the students for families in need of a little extra assistance.
- December 23, 2015@21:37 hours, Officer John Hamlin stopped a vehicle on East Main Street for suspicion of DUI after dispatch put out a be on the lookout (BOL) for the vehicle after numerous concerned citizens called in to report it. The male operator was screened and taken into custody for DUI. Back at the office he was processed and registered an evidentiary breath test of .203%. He was cited into court to answer the DUI charge and released to his wife.
- December 28, 2015@20:41 hours, Officer John Hamlin was dispatched to a 1 car accident on West Main Street near Kenyon Road. After arriving at the scene and identifying the 22 year old male operator he developed probable cause that he was under the influence of alcohol. Officer Hamlin followed rescue to the emergency room where the operator was treated and released at which point he was processed at the office for DUI. An evidentiary breath test was taken and it registered a BAC of .186%. After processing the operator was released to his mother with a citation ordering him into court to answer the DUI charge.
