- **May 28, 2013 at 01:11 hours Officer Jacob Hansell stopped a vehicle for erratic operation. The vehicle was changing speeds and operating left of center. Alcohol was not a factor but prescription drugs may have been. The operator was charged with C&N operation.**
- **May 30, 2013 at 23:47 hours Officer Jake Hansell was checking the Park & Ride on Route 2 when he encountered a vehicle with three people inside. He could smell burnt marijuana and a consent search was requested and granted. 1 marijuana pipe with residue was recovered along with 4 OXY pills that were not in a script bottle. No charges filed at this time.**
- **May 31, 2013 Chief investigated the theft of approximately \$4,000 worth of tools from a storage container at the Route 2 bridge construction. The container was recently moved and**

no longer was hooked up to the security/video system. The foreman had no suspects and did not believe any of his employees were involved. All items that met NCIC criteria were entered into the data base.

- May 31, 2013 at 08:15 hours Officers William Bullock and Rick Greenough responded to a trespass complaint at Riverview Commons. An unknown female was located in a resident's mobile home. When officers arrived she refused to leave or identify herself and attempted to slam the door in the officer's face. The 30 year old female suspect became violent and had to be physically subdued in the driveway. Once back at the office a search of her backpack took place as she refused to identify herself and appeared to be intoxicated but also refused a breath test. As the holding cell was under renovations the Chief was watching her in the interview room when he again became violent and attempted to leave at which time the Chief had to take her down to the floor. She accused all of us as hurting her and trying to look at her "junk". Rescue was called and she was transported to the emergency room under our care. Identification was located in her backpack and a check showed she was currently under several court conditions because of multiple pending charges. Approximately 5 ½ hours after the ordeal started and with the assistance of P & P an Alco sensor breath test was administered which resulted in a BAC of .05%. She was transferred to the custody of the Sheriff's department at court and was held for the weekend at the regional correctional center now facing charges of resisting arrest, unlawful trespass & violation of court conditions.
- On June 1, 2013 at 23:54 hours Officer Joshua Hansell stopped a vehicle which resulted in the operator being charged with DUI after he blew a .138% BAC.
- June 7, 2013 both Officers Jake & Josh Hansell took part in the Vermont Special Olympics Torch Run as it came through town.
- June 8, 2013 at 17:09 hours Officer Joshua Hansell investigated a rollover accident. The operator was charged with DUI after initially blowing a .09% BAC roadside and an evidentiary test of .081% at the office.
- June 8, 2013, late evening Officer Jacob Hansell was headed north on the interstate to drop off court work at the courthouse drop box. He clocked on radar a vehicle travelling at 115 miles per hour. Once stopped the operator who was under 21 years of age blew just under the legal BAC at .078%. The operator was charged with Careless & Negligent operation and cited into court. He was also issued a \$501 speeding ticket and a 21b ticket for a minor having consumed alcohol in excess of .02%.
- This week the holding cell was remodeled to include the addition of a steel bunk, toilet and sink. Persons under arrest will no longer have to be escorted up/down the narrow stairs leading to the second floor.
