- July 9, 2013@00:34 hours Officer Jake Hansell stopped a car for speeding. The order of marijuana could be detected coming from the vehicle. The operator from Quebec, Canada was asked for consent to search which was granted. Approximately 4 grams of marijuana was located in the vehicle. The operator was issued a traffic ticket and was also issued paperwork ordering him into the Chittenden County Diversion program for the marijuana offense.
- July 10, 2013@09:52 hours Officer Brett Lindemuth and Chief Buck were called to a home on River Road (VT. Route 117) for a violation of a court ordered Domestic Abuse Prevention Order. The male suspect had for the third time in a week & half violated the order by showing up at the home and harassing the female victim. The male subject fled the scene. Officer Lindemuth obtained statements from the victim and several witnesses and prepared the court work. Believing the suspect was in the Burlington area the Burlington Police Department was notified and Officer Lindemuth went to the area. While going to Burlington the suspect had been arrested by Burlington P.D. on a burglary charge as he was attempting to break into a building in the city. The suspect was taken to Vermont Superior Court and was arraigned on our charge as well as Burlington's. The first 2 times we dealt with him earlier he was jailed by our members but released by the court after initial arraignment.
- July 11, 2013@20:16 hours Officer Joshua Hansell was called to an accident near the intersection of Kenyon & Hinesburg Roads. Witnesses had advised seeing the female operator carrying beer cans away from the vehicle to a nearby home. After arriving at the scene a few minutes later officer Hansell made contact with the female who refused to come out of the home but would yell and taunt Officer Hansell and the assisting Williston Police Officer. While applying for a search warrant to enter the home and take the operator into custody she came out of the home and onto the lawn yelling at officers at which time she was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI. The female was transported to the Williston Police office for processing as she continually for the next 3 ½ hours yelled and screamed at officers and had advised she injured her toe. When she refused to walk into the P.D. Officer Hansell ended up carrying her into the building. Williston rescue was summoned to the scene but she was not transported. The female suspect finally gave a sample of her breath which registered a BAC of .150%. She was transported to ACT 1 but was refused and was then jailed at the correctional center. Officer Hansell came in the next morning to complete the paperwork as he was headed to an out of state training assignment for his commitment with the Vermont Air National Guard.
- July 19, 2013@0841 hours we received a 911 hang up call from Tilden Ave. As Officer Rick Greenough responded to the scene he radioed me the description of a possible vehicle as we were both familiar with the address and a male from the area. As I approached Route 2 and the I.S. 89 southbound on-ramp I observed a vehicle matching the description. A traffic stop was attempted but the vehicle continued west on Route 2 and then onto Route 117 prior to stopping at the Lucky Spot. The operator and lone occupant was identified as Officer Rick Greenough proceeded to the scene. Based on evidence obtained by Officer Greenough the operator was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI after he blew a roadside test which registered a BAC of .194%. The suspect was also issued a notice of No Trespass for the home of his parents located on Tilden Ave. After processing was completed the operator was transported to ACT 1 to detox.

- July 19, 2013@01:06 hours. Officers Jake Hansell and Lance Martel assisted the Hinesburg Police department with an underage drinking party. Approximately 25 people were located at the scene with 11 16&17 year old teens cited for alcohol offences.
- July 20, 2013@09:31 hours, Officer William Bullock stopped a vehicle for running a red light at the intersection of Main and Bridge Street. The male operator was under criminal suspension for 7 prior suspension violations. He was taken into custody, processed at the office and released on a citation ordering him into Chittenden Court to answer the charge.
- July 22, 2013@07:18 Chief Buck responded to Tilden Ave. for a trespass complaint. A 44 year old male was taken into custody after violating a trespass order he was issued on Friday the 19th by the P.D. He was given a breath test and registered a BAC of .09 %. He was taken back to the office where he was processed and released on a citation to answer the charge in Chittenden Court. At 08:36 hours myself and Officer Rick Greenough were called back to the residence as the suspect was now standing in the roadway throwing stones at the house. He informed us when we arrived that he was not trespassing because he was on a public road. He was taken into custody again and charged with Disorderly Conduct. He was processed at the scene and transported to the Medical Center hospital after claiming he was beaten by his father with a 2X4 and that he was coughing up blood. He also complained that his wrist/arm hurt because of handcuffing even though they were not tight and had been double locked so they cannot tighten on their own. This is the same male subject that we arrested on Friday the 19th at 08:41 hours and was charged with DUI after blowing a roadside BAC of .194%. I examined the suspect and there was no sign of a physical injury such as bruising, lacerations or cuts on his torso and even though he had not been to a doctor he claimed he had broken ribs and a collapsed lung.
- Mics: Had a couple of reported burglary complaints. On Westall Dr. while the family were all in the backyard in the pool or doing yard work someone entered the unlocked home between 1300-1600 hours removing a \$500 I-Pad from the kitchen counter. On Southview sometime during the late evening someone pried open a door to the garage which was full of tools but the owner advised that it appeared that nothing was taken, just the damage to the door. Had a couple of vehicles broken into and property stolen from them as they were parked on Dugway Road and occupants at the gorge. A side window smashed out and property left in plain sight taken. Had a brand new 37" television stolen from a porch at a Lower Circle home sometime between June 27th and July 22nd. Victim had ordered it on line and Fed Ex records indicated it was delivered on June 27th but victim never received it so she contacted the on line vendor. She reported it on 072213 after consulting with Fed Ex.
