### **ARRESTS**

**Operating while suspended (criminal): 1**

- January 1, 2014- Officer Josh Hansell and his long time girlfriend welcomed a new son. He arrived in the world weighing 9 pounds and 12 ounces.
- January 5, 2014@ 11:00 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth stopped a vehicle on East Main Street by Harrington's for speeding. The male operator was found to be criminally suspended in Vermont. He was processed and released on a citation to appear in Chittenden Superior Court.
- January 6, 2014@ 11:32 hours, Officer Rick Greenough and myself were called to Robbins Mountain Road for an untimely death. The 67 year old male had been suffering from ALS for the last six years. As his wife assisted him into the bathroom he collapsed onto the floor. CPR was administered by his wife and later members of Richmond Rescue without results. The medical examiner's office was contacted and arrived. The investigation determined that the death was not suspicious.
- January 12<sup>th</sup>, Officer Brett Lindemuth and myself assisted with the flooding in town. Affected areas were Route 2 in Jonesville and Cochran Road. Both Roads had to be closed for an extended period of time.
- January 13<sup>th</sup>, I and Officer Rick Greenough assisted the fire departments fighting the barn fire on East Main Street at the old Andrew's farm. Tanker trucks had to use a hydrant by the town center as the one at the intersection of Bridge Street and Main Street had frozen. Main Street from Bridge to Cochran Road was closed from approximately 05:30-11:00 hours as crews extinguished the fire. Officer Greenough directed traffic near the town center while I conducted traffic control at Bridge and Main.
