- May 11, 2016, Officer Mat Nadeau put together an arrest warrant package for the States Attorney's office. He attempted to locate the male suspect in a fraud involving stolen debit cards and their owners 4 digit number. Working with Burlington Police the staff at COTS would not confirm that the suspect was staying. He has been charged with multiple counts and additional charges maybe filed when the rest of the bank records are received.
- May 12, 2016@ 20:38 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau responded to a Riverview Commons home for a juvenile dispute. Seems the 14 year old female claimed father locked her out of home so she took off. This is just one of many encounters we have dealt with involving this teenage girl and when Officer Nadeau located her up on Jericho Road she was informed that any further encounters would result in her being sent to court. Both the States Attorney's Office and DCF were notified of this continual issue.
- May 13, 2016@ 17:37 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau was dispatched to a citizen dispute at a Hilltop Circle home. Seems the elderly couple was having a verbal dispute and one female was highly intoxicated (.190%) and suffering from early onset Alzheimer's. It was determined that a friend from Fairfax would come and pick her up instead of us taking her to ACT 1 for detox.
- May 13, 2016@ 21:16 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau was again called to Riverview Commons for the same runaway 14 year old female juvenile. This time she was located at a home in Milton by Milton Police who transported her to the Williston State Police Barracks where Officer Nadeau took her into custody. Arrangements were made through DCF and her father to have her stay the night at her grandmother's home and then Mat prepared the paperwork for a court hearing on the following afternoon.
- May 15, 2016@ 16:58 hours, Officer John Hamlin stopped a vehicle on East Main Street for travelling 52 in a posted 40 mile per hour zone. A computer record check revealed that there was an active arrest warrant on the 21 year old male operator out of Vermont. He was taken into custody, processed at the office and then taken to the Chittenden County jail.
- May 15, 2016@ 02:12 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau was working a GHSP DUI overtime program when he stopped a vehicle for speeding. Probable cause was established that the 20 year old

male operator was under the influence of alcohol. The male refused all test both roadside and at the office. He was charged with DUI and released to his father.

- May 16, 2016@ 15:31 hours, myself and Officer John Hamlin responded to a reported accident located at the intersection of Hillview Road (S) and Huntington Road. When we arrived the vehicle was unattended down over an embankment with extensive damage. Information was gathered that the operator was picked up and driven to his home in Charlotte by a passing driver. Information was also gathered from the scene and a witness that the operator was probably under the influence and a Trooper was dispatched to the operator's house. When the Trooper arrived he could see him huffing the small CO2 cartridges. We also located hundreds of these same CO2 cartridges all over the floor board of the vehicle. A roadside breath test by the Trooper only registered a BAC of .059% BAC. Based on all the information gathered, Officer Hamlin has charged him with careless & negligent operation of a motor vehicle.
- May 16, 2016@ 16:56 hours, myself and Officer John Hamlin responded to Milo White Road in Jericho to assist the Vermont State Police with a suicidal adult male. I arrived along with Sgt. Bob Lucas and discovered the male had stabbed himself numerous times in the stomach and neck area with a steak knife. While waiting for rescue to arrive I had Officer Hamlin grab a first aid kit and I started to bandage his stomach wounds while Sgt. Lucas attended to the neck wounds. I located the knife underneath the man which was turned over to VSP. Richmond Rescue arrived a short time later and transported the man to the emergency room while being followed by VSP. The gentleman has a long history of mental illness beginning when he was a teenager.
- May 16, 2016@ 20:19 hours, Officer John Hamlin was requested by dispatch to respond to the Jolley Store located on Route 15 in Jericho for a reported possible ongoing assault. When he arrived he located a person of interest and it was determined that the assault was not ongoing and possibly occurred in Cambridge.
- May 16, 2016@ 21:46 hours, Officer John Hamlin responded to East Main Street for a reported home invasion and that the home owner was carrying a loaded 9mm handgun. Officers from Williston Police as well as State Police also responded. After arrival at the scene it was determined that no home invasion had occurred and that the caller was highly intoxicated and that his partner was attempting to calm him down. The weapon was secured without incident and the officers cleared from the scene as the partner was going to take care of the complainant. This is not the first time we have responded to this location when the party involved gets intoxicated and calls into law enforcement.
- May 17, 2016@ 13:49 hours, Cpl. Brett Lindemuth and myself responded to a Riverview Common home for a citizen dispute. Seems the 25 year old daughter had locked her mother out of her own home. The younger female had just appeared in court earlier that morning and was now intoxicated and most likely still high on another drug. She became disorderly and was calling her mother nom complimentary names. The young woman was currently out of court on conditions which included no alcohol. A brief roadside test registered a BAC of .127% and that was only with a slight puff indicating she was much higher. Part of her conditions included she provide an evidentiary breath sample which she refused. She was taken to the county jail charged with disorderly conduct and violation of court conditions.

- May 17, 2016@ 15:03 hours, Officer Hamlin investigated a two vehicle accident located at the intersection of Main Street and Jericho Road. It was determined that the 18 year old male coming off Jericho Road had run the red light hitting the left front of an east bound vehicle on Main Street. The 18 year old male was ticketed for the violation. While just finishing up with this accident he was dispatched to a second two vehicle accident at 16:00 hours that was located at the intersection of West Main and Kenyon Road. It was determined that a west bound vehicle stopped waiting to turn left onto Kenyon Road while a second west bound vehicle could not stop and ended up wedging himself between the first vehicle and the guardrails. The second operator was ticketed for speed to fast /accident resulting and for not wearing a seat belt.
- May 18, 2016, Cpl. Rick Greenough has been following up on a retail theft that occurred approximately 1 month earlier. Numerous attempts to track down the two adult male suspects at either the Bolton Access Road address or the Waterbury address were unsuccessful until today. One male was cited into court and the second male identified but not located at this time.
- May 19, 2016@ 05:58 hours, I was dispatched to the area of East Main Street near Cochran Road for a report of a black male attempting to flag vehicles down and appeared distraught. A couple of minutes later I located the male just over the town line in Bolton. Seems the man from Michigan was in the state for a job with a friend. After going to Burlington drinking the friend wanted to find some on-line female companionship, however my gentlemen did not want to go or drive intoxicated and an argument ensued resulting in this gentlemen being abandoned beside the road with little cash, no credit cards and only jeans and a short sleeve shirt. The temperature was only 48 degrees and having been in a tech school in the Houston Texas area he was not accustomed to the weather. I allowed him to call his mother and girlfriend, loaned him a fleece liner and ended up transporting him to Burlington where he could get a Western Union money gram and a bus ticket to his girlfriend's home in Pennsylvania and a promise to mail back the fleece liner.
