- February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017; I received a report from a female in Duxbury who was concerned for the welfare of her grandson who was currently residing/working in Richmond. She had not heard from him in several days and he had not shown up to work or contacted his employer. After speaking with several known associates of the male I was able to locate him at a nearby

residence in Huntington. The male was recovering from an illness and was in the process of making contact with the concerned parties.

- March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017; Cpl. Brett Lindemuth received a report from a tipster who advised a former resident who had an active warrant out for his arrest had returned to the area after fleeing the state to avoid prosecution. The information provided was passed along to the area agency where he was known to be staying.
- March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017; Cpl. William Bullock handled a reported dispute between residents on Church Street regarding a barking dog. Cpl. Bullock was able to mediate the disagreement and bring the parties to a resolution.
- March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017; While working an overtime detail in the town of Jericho, Ofc. John Hamlin conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding. Ofc. Hamlin's observation led him to believe that the 3 female juvenile occupants were in possession of marijuana. Consent was granted to search the vehicle. A small amount of marijuana and several pieces of paraphernalia were located and seized.
- March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017; Cpl. William Bullock received a report of a male resident who was threatening to poison cats in the neighborhood who kept coming onto his porch and getting into his garbage. Cpl. Bullock made contact with the male and provided him with lawful alternatives to alleviate his feline frustrations.
- March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2017; While working an overtime detail in town, Ofc. John Hamlin conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding. The female operator was determined to be civilly suspended and did not possess valid insurance for the vehicle. Additionally, Ofc. Hamlin discovered that the plates on the vehicle were not assigned to that vehicle. The vehicle was grounded and the license plates were seized.
- March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017; I received a report from a female who advised her juvenile daughter had fled her residence after the two were involved in an argument. She left the area with several juvenile males and refused to return home. Upon arrival to the area, the mother informed me that she had made contact with the juvenile and learned that she had been picked up by the mother of one of the juvenile males. She agreed to return home after learning that the police had been contacted. When the female arrived on scene I made contact with the adult female operator of the vehicle who was determined to be under criminal suspension for prior DUI convictions. I additionally discovered that she had alcohol in her system. After being taken into custody she provided a PBT of 0.054%. Ofc. Hamlin arrived on scene to assist with the incident. The juvenile female was released into the custody of her father, the juvenile male was released into the custody of a family friend and the vehicle was towed away from the location. The female was processed, issued a criminal citation and released on her own recognizance.
- March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2017; While participating in a SHARP detail in the town of Essex, Cpl. Brett Lindemuth conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle operating erratically pulling out of the parking lot of On Tap. The male operator was determined to be under criminal suspension for prior convictions for DUI. The male was issued a traffic violation and a criminal citation to appear in court and answer to the charge of Criminal DLS. He was allowed to continue driving to his destination due to his acting as a designated driver for his passenger.

- March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017; Vermont State Police received a report of a vehicle off the roadway on Brown's Trace Road in Jericho. There were no troopers available at the time so Richmond Police were asked to respond. Cpl. Richard Greenough and Ofc. John Hamlin arrived on scene and made contact with the male operator. The male was showing signs of impairment. After conducting Standard Field Sobriety Exercises Ofc. Hamlin took the male into custody under suspicion of Driving Under the Influence. The male was processed at Richmond Police Department and provided an evidentiary sample of his breath indicating a BAC of 0.083%. The male was subsequently released into his father's custody.
- March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017; I received a report from Richmond Market advising they had received a \$10.00 bill which they believed to be fake. The investigation is ongoing.
