Dear Josh:

Congratulations! I am very pleased to inform you that the Vermont Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and the Vermont Division for Historic Preservation (VDHP) have awarded State Historic Preservation Grant Funds in an amount up to \$14,801.00 to the Town of Richmond to partially fund the historic preservation project at the Richmond Free Library described in the grant application submitted for funding for this project.

This year, 41 applications were submitted to VDHP, requesting \$639,593 in matching funds. The selection process is always very competitive because we receive many more applications than we can fund. With just under \$300,000 available to award this year, we were able to fully fund 18 grant projects.

To accept this award of grant funding, you will need to fill out and return:

- A *2022 Historic Preservation Grant Award Conditions and Acknowledgement Form* (attached),
- A Certificate of Insurance that demonstrates your organization has insurance in the types and amounts required as listed in the *State Historic Preservation Grants 2022 Grant Administration Manual*, and
- A completed and signed w-9 Form (attached) with your organization's tax ID number.

You must return these materials to caitlin.corkins@vermont.gov by Friday, February 4, 2022.

Please keep in mind that the submission of the requested materials may not completely satisfy the award conditions as outlined in the *2022 Award Conditions and Acknowledgement Form* as staff may have further questions upon their review. Once the applicable Award Conditions are fulfilled, VDHP will prepare a formal Grant Agreement contract for your signature and the State's signature.

You cannot start any work on the grant-funded project until the Grant Agreement is signed by both you and the State.

You will have until **December 31, 2024**, to complete your project.

Please be advised, failure to meet the timeframes set forth in the *2022 Grant Administration Manual* enclosed with this award letter may result in your required appearance before the Vermont Advisory Council on Historic Preservation to explain the reasons why and/or in the forfeiture of the use of these funds.
