Good Afternoon Tyler, Kendall,

Thanks! Please see the attached revisions to the Richmond Market Site Plan and Specifications Sheet based on your W/S comments. Let me know if you think! missed something.

I am getting the easement locations updated/added by Button. I will send the revised plat along once complete. They were all approved at 10' for the Whistle Stop Ln applications so we have kept them consistent on this one too.

We haven't gotten a sprinkler design yet, so I don't have an expected fire flow demand. When we modeled this area of the system for Whistle Stop Ln (PTC application attached), based on a fire flow test on the Bridge St/Railroad St intersection, we had an available flow of almost 2,000 gpm with 20 psi available on top of the plateau. We would be OK with a condition of approval to submit the buildings fire flow demand for review prior to obtaining a zoning permit. I wouldn't think the fire flow demand would be too much more than the existing Market.
