- July 12, 2016@ 20:05 hours, Officer John Hamlin contacted a suspicious 44 year old male at Volunteers Green. We had recently arrested this male approximately a month earlier on a disorderly conduct charge and he failed to show up for court when ordered. A computer check revealed that subject currently had an outstanding arrest warrant issued for him and he was taken into custody without incident.

- July 13, 2016, Cpl. Brett Lindemuth has continued to follow up on a theft of a paycheck complaint from May 17, 2016. The 17 year old female victim had her \$263.00 paycheck stolen and then cashed. Working with Burlington Police one adult male suspect was located at his Burlington home. During the interview he confessed to getting the check from another adult male, cashing it and then keeping \$25.00 for his efforts and giving the rest of the money to his buddy. The second adult male who is known to this department from past interactions and is known to avoid police is doing just that. The one male suspect has now been cited into court to face forgery and receiving stolen property while an arrest warrant has been requested for the second party on charges of forgery, receiving stolen property and conspiracy to commit forgery.
- July 13, 2016@ 07:57 hours, Cpl. William Bullock and myself responded to the dentist office on Bridge Street for a reported burglary. Sometime over the evening hours a window was smashed and the building entered. The thief(s) then made off with approximately \$150.00 in change from a donation jar and 5 gold crowns awaiting installation into their patients. I dusted for latent fingerprints and we also collected several items which were brought to the Vermont State Police forensic lab for fingerprinting.
- July 13, 2016, Cpl. William Bullock has been working on a theft case from May 29<sup>th</sup> in which a \$21,000 ring and cash were stolen from a home. Probable cause has since been developed and a 17 year old male from Winooski has been charged with grand larceny and cited into Chittenden Court.
- Back on July 7<sup>th</sup>, Officer Mat Nadeau took a burglary complaint from a Westall Drive home where a laptop computer was reported stolen. Since the initial complaint it was determined that no burglary took place and that the 8 year old child residing in the home did not want to do homework and hid the computer.
- July 15, 2016@ 01:10 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau was assisting the Vermont State Police with a mentally disturbed adult male who was jumping out in front of cars on Route 15 in Jericho. The male would not abide with commands to stop when told to by Officer Nadeau and then fled on foot. Mat ended up chasing him on foot and takes him into custody until Troopers arrived. The adult male was transported to the emergency room by Cpl. Michele LeBlanc for a mental health evaluation.
- July 15, 2016@ 19:20 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau received a report of a broken down vehicle located on East Main Street by the Monitor Barn. Officer Nadeau arrived at the scene to find the vehicle unoccupied and the registration plates belonging to a different vehicle and registered to a Richmond resident. A short time later he located an adult male stumbling down West Main Street carrying a small child on his shoulders when he then tripped and almost fell over with the young girl still on his shoulders. After speaking with the 38 year old male he admitted he had been driving the car with the child approximately 20 minutes earlier when it broke down. Mat recognized that the man was highly intoxicated and roadside registered a BAC of .216%. He was taken into custody and processed at the office where he registered an evidentiary breath test at .200%. Because of his high intoxication level he was taken to ACT 1 in Burlington and cited into court for DUI and child endangerment.

- July 19, 2016@ 12:35 hours, a young adult couple came into the office and turned over a game camera to Cpl. Brett Lindemuth. Seems the camera was mounted near the lower gorge and was taking photos of people nude and dressing and undressing at the swim site.
- July 20, 2016@ 22:34 hours, Officer John Hamlin stopped a vehicle on Route 117 by the Lucky Spot store for speeding and defective equipment. When he approached the vehicle which had two 21 year olds in it he could smell the marijuana coming from the car. A consent search was granted by the operator and a small amount of marijuana and a couple of grinders were located. Both were issued a civil ticket for possession of marijuana and sent on their way as there was no sign of impaired operation.
- July 22, 2016@ 16:47 hours, Officer John Hamlin ended up assisting the Vermont State Police on Interstate 89 near mile marker 75 (Richmond Flats) initially for a tractor trailer on fire and then for multiple accidents that happened while the fire was being extinguished. After several hours the scene was finally cleaned up.
- July 24, 2016@ 21:47 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau stopped a vehicle on East Main Street for operating left of center and for throwing a lit cigarette out the window. The vehicle was occupied by two males age 16 and 17. A consent search was conducted a cigarettes, marijuana and 13 unopened cans of beer were located. Each was issued diversion tickets for the alcohol and marijuana possession and the operator was issued a civil violation for the cigarette possession.
- July 26, 2016@ 00:48 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau stopped a vehicle on Hinesburg Road for operating left of center. While speaking with the 19 year old operator probable cause was established that he was under the influence. He was screened roadside to include an Alco-sensor which registered a BAC of .137%. He was taken into custody and processed at the office where an evidentiary breath sample registered a BAC of .164%. After processing he was transported to ACT 1 in Burlington for detox. and issued a citation ordering him into Chittenden Superior Court to answer a DUI charge.
