- February 28, 2015@16:31 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau investigated a vandalism complaint at the Richmond Park & Ride located by exit 11. Sometime during the day a window was smashed out of a vehicle but the victim could not determine if anything was stolen from the vehicle.
- March 1, 2015@21:12 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau observed a vehicle traveling east on East Main Street operating erratically and crossing the center line of the roadway. The vehicle was stopped on East Main and the27 year old female operator and male passenger were identified. The female operator showed signs of intoxication and standard field sobriety test were conducted roadside along with a roadside breath test which registered a BAC of .130%. The operator was taken into custody and transported for an evidentiary test. After numerous attempts to get a complete breath sample, a sample was finally obtained at approximately midnight which registered a BAC of .086%. The operator was cited to appear in Chittenden Superior Court to answer a charge of DUI. She and her boyfriend who was more intoxicated than she was released to the operator's mother. The operator and her boyfriend at the time of the stop were headed home to Duxbury after having been in Burlington for the Mardi Gras celebration.
- March 4, 2015@10:47 hours, Officer Brett Lindemuth stopped a vehicle on East Main Street after he recognized the male operator as having his right to drive criminally suspended and had just recently arrested him for the same offence. The vehicle was pulled over on Jericho Road where the operator was taken into custody and charged with operating while criminally suspended. He was issued a citation ordering him to appear in Chittenden Superior Court to answer the charge.
- March 5, 2015@16:35 hours, Officer Lance Martel investigated a theft complaint from a Summer Street home. The suspect was identified; however the victim who knew the suspect did not want criminal charges filed. During the theft approximately \$350 worth of property was taken to include an old laptop computer, a small amount of cash and jewelry.
- March 8, 2015@23:26 hours, Officer Mat Nadeau stopped a vehicle on West Main Street because of an expired registration. The 30 year old male operator from Richmond was operating with a suspended license (civil) and appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The operator was screened roadside and blew a .194% BAC. He was taken into custody and processed at the office where an evidentiary breath sample was taken and registered a BAC of .154%. He was issued a citation ordering him into Chittenden Superior Court and released into the custody of his mother.
