 Jon Kart presentation- He is concerned about invasive plants such as Japanese Barberry, Poison Parsnip, and Japanese Knotweed. Not only are they invasive, but some like the Barberry also encourage mice, which often also carry ticks with Lyme Disease.

There is an invasive plant management plan for the town. The town has a significant flood plain forest that needs to be protected. Many volunteer hours have helped to decrease the invasive plants significantly. They mapped invasive infestations around the trails and would like to repeat this in late May/early June. Jon wanted to know if the committee would participate. So far they have focused on the Rivershore trail and would be open to expanding to other trails.

The trail committee agreed to work to help inventory what invasives we observe. Jon will provide additional information to the committee when the time gets closer.

Jon also raised the concern about erosion happening near the canoe access at the Beeken Preserve and along Volunteer's Green.

- Tyler walked potential entrances to the Preston trails along Thompson Rd. The committee feels it could be disruptive to Billy Preston to access the trail along his driveway, so Tyler is exploring other options.

The committee will walk the upper section of the Preston Property soon to work out the plans for the next trail extension. The committee needs to then update the landowners who have given permission to have parts of the trail on their land about the planned extensions.
