Unlike others, it is still rich with flora and fauna, giving it a key role in sustaining the ecological integrity of the multi-thousand-acre Chittenden County Uplands Conservation Project of which it is a part. Few towns can claim such an asset. That's why I hope to continue helping our Town ensure that the Forest is cared for and utilized according to its Conservation Easement and Management Plan.
