SUBJECT: FY22 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

On July 14, 2021, the Town received notice that it had been allocated funding for two transportation planning projects as part of the FY22 Unified Planning Work Program:

- 1. Richmond Village Sidewalks Scoping Study A scoping study for sidewalks within Richmond Village and areas adjacent to the village. This project would investigate extending existing facilities and connecting facilities that are currently unconnected. The total budget for this project is \$60,000, of which the town provides \$12,000 as a local match.
- 2. Richmond Bicycle/Pedestrian Master Plan Phase 2 This is the second and final phase of a two-year master planning project. The second phase focuses on the southern half of the town. The total budget for this project is \$40,000, of which the town provides \$8,000 as a local match.

The notification letter from Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) is enclosed.

The Richmond Village Sidewalks Scoping Study will specifically investigate the feasibility of sidewalks along the following three segments:

- 1. Huntington Road, from the end of the sidewalk across the street from the Round Church Corners commercial area (approximately 61 Huntington Road) to the Johnnie Brook Trail head.
- 2. Bridge Street, from the end of the sidewalk next to the former bank (approximately 24 Bridge Street) to Volunteers Green.
- 3. Jericho Road, from School Street to Valley View Road

A map of the project scope areas is enclosed.

Going forward, provided is the general timeline for UPWP projects:

- 1. August/September 2021 Consultant selection. CCRPC provides us a shortlist of prequalified consultants for each project and the town provides recommendations on which consultants it would like to work with.
- 2. October/November 2021 Project kickoff meeting.
- 3. November 2021 through May 2022 Evaluation of existing conditions, public meetings and investigation into alternatives.
- 4. May/June 2022 Wrap up project, and present conclusions and preferred alternatives


