Whereas, Harriet & Heath brought forth three children, Linda, Bruce & Kent who were educated in the Richmond School System.

Whereas, Harriet served as a 4-H Leader under the University of Vermont Extension Service for many years, specializing in Foods and Home Economics.

Whereas, Harriet served as a freelance correspondent for the Burlington Free Press, beginning in 1953, wrote a number of articles related to Richmond.

Whereas, Harriet was named Mrs. Vermont in 1957 based on Community Service & her work as President of the Richmond Parent Teacher Association.

Whereas, Harriet served as the first female Deacon of the Richmond Congregational Church and has been a very active member of the Church for over 65 years.

Whereas Harriet was a founding member of the Richmond Historical Society & served as Old Round Church Guide for many years.

Whereas, Harriet, with others, was the author of the book, Richmond VT, A History of More Than 200 Years.

Whereas Harriet has served as the Richmond Town Historian for many years.
