Hi Judy,

I won't be available to join the meeting on Tuesday but am happy to provide advice when you have a

better understanding on the situation. I will provide some general information below.

Jon provided you with a link that has a bunch of resources about beavers in Vermont. I have attached a

copy of the Best Management Practices for Resolving Human - Beaver Conflicts in Vermont, which

discusses beaver biology, management, techniques for resolving conflicts and some of the rules and

regulations around wetlands. This document can also be found at the link.

We don't allow for the translocation of wildlife in VT, meaning wildlife cannot be moved away from the

property it was captured on. There are many reasons for this including potentially spreading disease

over a greater distance and it is often not a humane solution for the animal. Moving an animal to an

area that is not familiar with can cause the animal to starve or die from exposure and increases the chance of predation.

Feel free to pass my information along to others and I am happy to discuss further.
