**Issue:** Playground surfacing materials had thinned out in several locations. Loose-fill surfacing materials require special maintenance.

Recommendation: Mark ideal surfacing depths on equipment posts. Monitor surface material depths and distribution and rake displaced material back into its proper place so that a constant depth is maintained throughout the playground. New material will need to be added periodically to maintain the appropriate surfacing depth.

You will need 9 inches of wood chips based on the height of the highest play structure.

Issue: There was inadequate distance (clearance) between the underside of the swing seat and the playground surfacing material.

**Recommendation:** The vertical distance between the underside of the seat and the protective surfacing should be at least 12 inches. This is specifically for the tire swing. It currently measure 9" from the ground and it should be 12".


