B. PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- 1. Statement of Need: Identify the issue or need that the program will address (use statistical data to justify the need for the program). To what extent does this need, or problem exist in the Town of Richmond?
 - Our programs provide an environment for youth to improve physical fitness, and mental well-being, learn team-building skills, and gain positive social skills through interactions with coaches and teammates. Our league is 100% volunteer based including coaches, board members, and field maintenance. Camels Hump Little League (formerly Richmond Area Little League) serves Richmond youth and our surrounding towns, Huntington and Bolton, building a strong community bond with our three towns. Over the years we have relied heavily on parent volunteers donating hundreds of hours of labor to maintain the Richmond Baseball Fields. The cost for clay to resurface one field is about \$2,500. The fields serve not only those participants in Camel's Hump Little League but Town residents in general as they are part of the public parks.

2. Program Summary:

 - Our program serves around 150 youth ages 5 12 during the Spring, Summer, and Fall seasons. Our program makes a strong effort to receive as many sponsorships as possible in order to keep registration costs affordable to all children and also being able to offer scholarships for those in need.

- b. Identify what is to be accomplished or what change will occur from participating in the program. How will people be better off as a result of participating in the program? Describe the steps you take to make the project known to the public, and make the program accessible and inclusive?
 - Children who participate in our program are given the opportunity to access quality coaching, team building, and physical fitness/training. Camels Hump Little League believes in the power of youth baseball and softball to teach life lessons that build stronger individuals and communities and this has been proven with the consistent development and growth of our program. Last summer (2022) Camels Hump Little League was able to send their first team of All-Stars into the tournament for the first time in about 10 years. This team won a game in the tournament for the first time in that many years as well. In the summer of 2023 we were able to create TWO all-stars teams! We are committed to continuing to build our registration as well as spreading awareness for not only baseball teams but softball teams as well.
 - The program is open to boys and girls ages 5-12. We use Front Porch Forum and Facebook to advertise the program. We also have an email database of past participants and partner with the local schools to get included in their newsletters.
 - We never turn away a child interested in playing. We have scholarships available for any family that cannot afford to register.

3. Program Funding:

 - After the massive flood this summer our fields are in desperate need of clay to make the fields safer for use. It costs about \$2,500 per field to resurface with clay. We may also need to replace some topsoil in the grass areas of the fields. Maintaining the fields is a benefit to our program and the Town at large as they are open to the public for general use.

 Our little league is committed to elevating our program by reaching out for more sponsorship opportunities, while also applying for grants from the Boston Red Sox, Dicks Sporting Goods, and VT Lake Monsters.
