Furr mentioned that the current bandshell does not allow for ADA 83 access and would adding a ramp change the footprint. Oborne replied that adding 84 85 accessibility is allowed and does not alter the footprint. Clarke mentioned that a 86 protective fence around the playground once it is relocated will be important. Thomas explained that as a representative of the Parks and Rec committee she thinks they will be 87 88 able to work within the new zoning regulations. Bressor mentioned that a footprint of a 89 structure is defined as where it is in contact with the ground. Clarke described that a 90 catwalk even if above ground is part of the square footage. 91 92 Hill moved to close the public hearing.
