Filkins suggested contract options to support 73 74 Cohen. Arneson reviewed that they 93 94 need 50% of the owners to sign a consent form agreeing to the special assessment district. 95 Once 50% of the property owners consent, the remaining property owners are then 96

subject to the assessment, and all owners of the property must sign the form. Arneson stated that they would look at the impervious surface for each individual property. Kaleita stated that they had been trying to comply and figure this out but they didn't know a year ago. Kaleita summarized that a few neighbors feel that the engineering plans are

100 lacking transparency and important information in the disconnection and the amount of impervious surface.
