In the Andrews Community Forest there are many tributaries of the Winooski, which feed into Lake Champlain. I would also like to highlight different waterways with signage as well. I think that it is very important to highlight and acknowledge the culture and impact of the Abenaki people and their deep ties to Vermont and the land we share.
