AOT Seeking Applications for Bicycle and Pedestrian Infrastructure Improvements

Barre, Vt. –The Vermont Agency of Transportation (AOT) is seeking grant applications for new infrastructure projects that improve access and safety for bicyclists and pedestrians. In 2022, awards totaled more than \$3.1 million for construction and planning projects throughout the state.

“Expanding opportunities for people to walk and bike safely in Vermont communities is a priority for our Agency and the State,” said Transportation Secretary Joe Flynn. “Good bicycling and pedestrian infrastructure is a vital element of livability that can stimulate economic development in our downtowns and improve public health.”

The AOT Bicycle and Pedestrian Program improves access and safety for bicyclists and pedestrians through the planning, design, and construction of infrastructure projects. The program improves transportation options for commuters, visitors to the state, and recreational use.
