46 47 48	Cote: We had a couple of candidates apply and interview. Brad Snow expressed interest and he has been doing the job, so we interviewed him. Brad has really stepped up as he

takes initiative with all of the State paperwork, and he has cleaned up all the messes from what we inherited.

Hill: He has a Class 3 water license, which is what he needs to run a water system but he's moving from Grade 1 to Grade 5 for wastewater.

Cote: He knows the system here in Richmond and has 10 years of experience with it.

Cote: We're working on little things as they come up. This week, we've had some discussion with a control company to upgrade the water common alarm. We have asked one company to give us a quote of separating out the water system and coming up with a mission system which is going to a cellular based system versus two-way radios. It would give us the ability to see everything that's happening at the water house and at the tank and in the future could build in a chlorine and fluoride monitor that you could check on your phone. We can currently tell the tank level at the water house but there is this ghost alarm between the pump station, which is wastewater, and the water house so you don't know what that alarm is for unless you physically go there. I am not happy with Simpleroute's answer for security and this system has a way better security system set up.

We're still cleaning lots of stuff and today we found the blueprints for the 1931 water system. We would like to get a copy made and actually put it up on the wall.

The fluoride pump has been installed and it's working wonderfully but still waiting for a new tank from the State. One of the issues was a large amount of inert salts so we cleaned/washed it out, got a new bag of fluoride, started from scratch and went right to the right numbers.

The two channels were supposed to come in February. The flocculator and PLC is not coming until May.

Cote: We didn't get the pump in until like the first week of January. I ordered the tank on a Friday, and it was here on a Monday. It came right back up once we put in the new fluoride. February's numbers will be much higher and rock solid. The two chlorine ones, it wasn't checked right. We do double check if we get a low day. That's a sign that we may have a leak, or we've got a contamination problem starting so that's why we do check them. For chlorine, you use a 55-gallon container of straight 15% sodium chloride and set the pump as these LMI pumps know exactly how much each dose is and you just do the calculations. There was the practice of being scared of overdosing.

135	position, which meant less contracting, and it has paid off. It's probably a conversation to
136	have with Josh about what staffing would it take versus the more costly contractors.

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Hill: Typically, the Annual Meeting is held on the third Tuesday in May at which point we should be dealing with budget and rates.

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166 Cote: I am really not happy with the way the line items are for the budgeting, it's very vague. I've got to get with Connie and see if there's the ability to change it.

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Hill: One option is to set up a 1.5-hour meeting of just budget and see how far we get and if we have to schedule another special budget meeting.

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Wolaver: We need Josh, Connie, and Steve. I would shoot for a special meeting like on March 11<sup>th</sup>.

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175 Cote: We asked Hoyle Tanner to try to calculate a more accurate cost to process septage.

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Update on water service line inventory and on water meters

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179 Cote: They have everything they've asked for. I believe we have completed all of the 180 connections that are in the houses. We're still working on the connections from the Town 181 to the curb stop. We've found all the blueprints and final designs so they should be 182 wrapping up here pretty soon. I believe the water meters are ordered and Josh put out an

RFP for the installation. We would like to do five of the new installations to know how to install one from scratch to finish.

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Hill: Another future agenda item is the water service line inventory, including the parts because I don't know how they know what my service line is.
