DiPietro Worden stated that the plant is running below capacity and has been accepting septage to press with sludge as a revenue stream. It provides higher revenue than the expenses it incurs. Short presented four different Analysis Alternatives. Short summarized that if you accept less septage, there is less of a net cost benefit for the Town. Short stated some conclusions that septage receiving generates more revenue than it incurs in expenses which lowers rates, dewatering is critical to minimize disposal and hauling expenses, user rate increases will be required to bond the project of any of the four alternatives, and the \$4.48 million grant application is currently under federal review. DiPietro Worden stated that one big project would be the most cost benefit for the Town compared to going out to bid in phases.
